

Full Paper Submission Guidelines

Submission of a full paper is optional. Authors who wish to have their work considered for publication in the Conference Proceedings Book are invited to submit a complete research paper following the guidelines below. These specifications are designed to align with the standards of Q1-indexed, peer-reviewed journals (ISI/Scopus), ensuring that accepted papers can later be expanded or adapted for journal submission.

1. Length and Formatting

- * Full papers should not be more than 25 pages (double spaced, Times New Roman, including all references and appendices).
- * Citation style: APA 7th Edition.
- * File type: Microsoft Word (.docx) only.

2. Paper Structure

Each full paper should include the following sections in order:

Title

* Concise and clear (no more than 20 words), reflecting key variables and theoretical focus.

Abstract

- * 250-400 words summarizing the purpose, methodology, participants/sample, key findings, and implications.
- * Include 5 keywords.

1. Introduction

- * State the research problem, context, and significance.
- * Identify the knowledge gap being addressed.
- * Present clear objectives, questions, or hypotheses.
- * Support with recent references (preferably from the past 5 years).

2. Theoretical Framework and Literature Review

- * Summarize key theories, models, and relevant studies.
- * Show clear linkage between theory and research question.
- * Explain how the current study extends or challenges prior work.

3. Methodology

- * Specify research design (quantitative, qualitative, or mixed).
- * Describe population, sample, and data collection instruments.
- * Indicate methods of data analysis (statistical or thematic).
- * Address validity/reliability or qualitative trustworthiness.



4. Results

- * Present findings clearly using concise tables or figures.
- * Describe key results without interpretation or speculation.

5. Discussion

- * Interpret findings in relation to theoretical framework and prior studies.
- * Explain possible reasons for similarities or differences.
- * Highlight the scientific contribution and implications.

6. Conclusion and Implications

- * Summarize major findings and practical implications.
- * Offer suggestions for future research.

- * Only original, unpublished work will be accepted.
- * All tables and figures must be original or properly licensed.
- * Use formal academic English; avoid translation-software artifacts.
- * Appendices are optional and should not exceed two pages.
